

Mandatory Language for Monitoring and Reporting Violation
Failure to Submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR)
MONITORING, ROUTINE (DBP), MAJOR/CHLORINE

The CENTRAL WCID OF ANGELINA COUNTY water system PWS ID 0030019 has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This violation occurred in the monitoring period First Quarter 01/01/2015 – 03/31/2015.

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

The Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report for First Quarter 01/01/2015 – 03/31/2015 was completed and mailed to TCEQ, but TCEQ did not receive it by the deadline. All samples taken were in compliance with TCEQ's Chlorine Residual guidelines.

In the future, Central Water Control & Improvement District will send each quarterly monitoring report by Certified Mail - Return Receipt required, ensuring delivery to TCEQ by the deadline.

Please share this information with all people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
